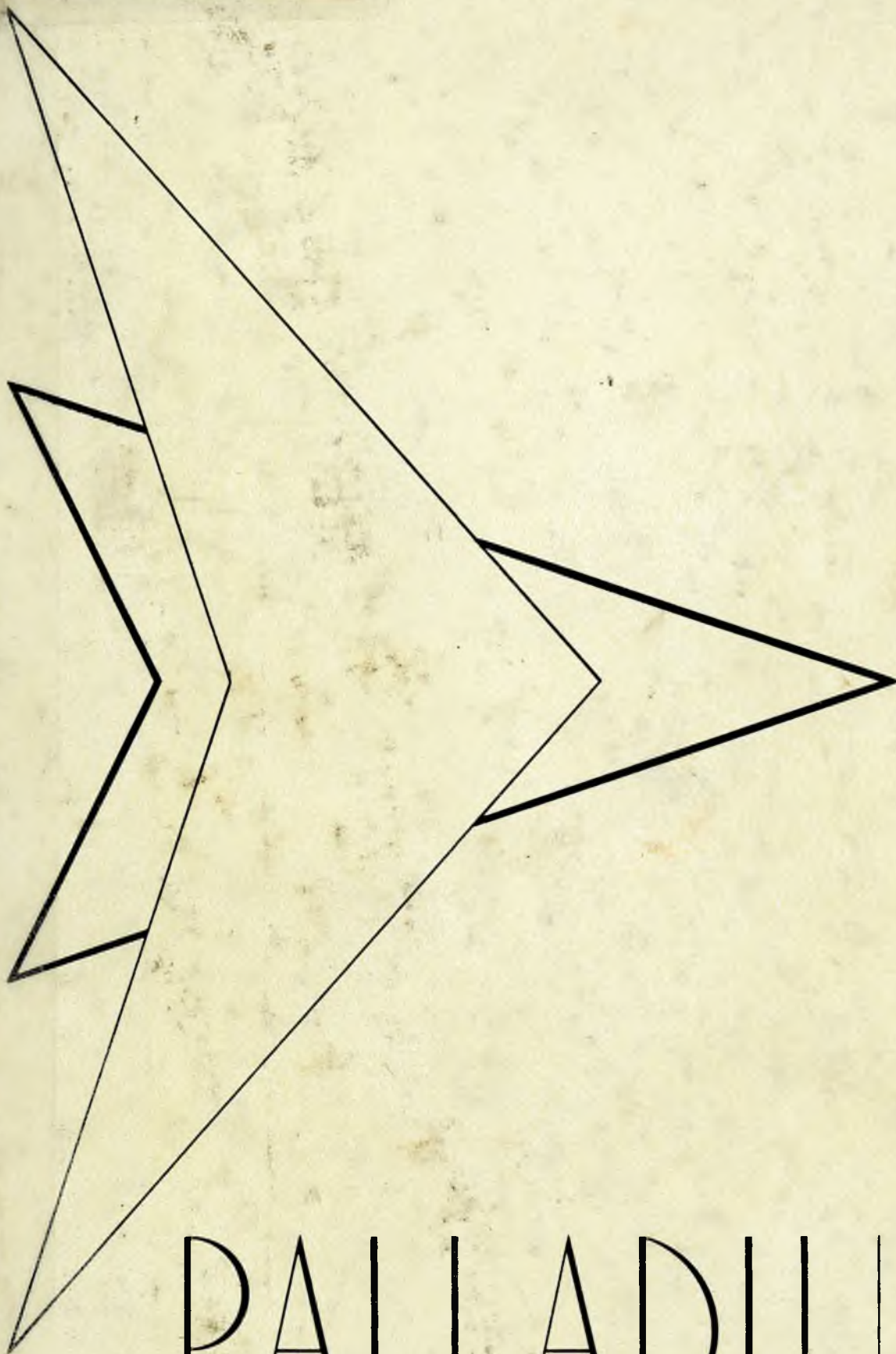

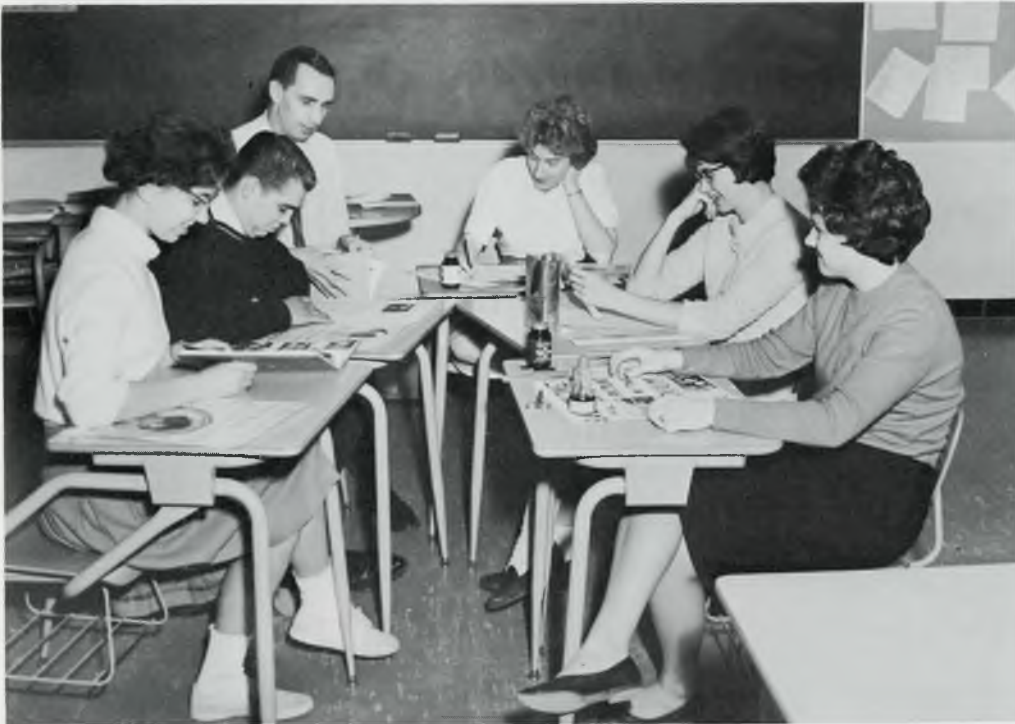


Sue and Diane are two of the girls who help Mr. Quay each hour by collecting and recording the attendance information.
