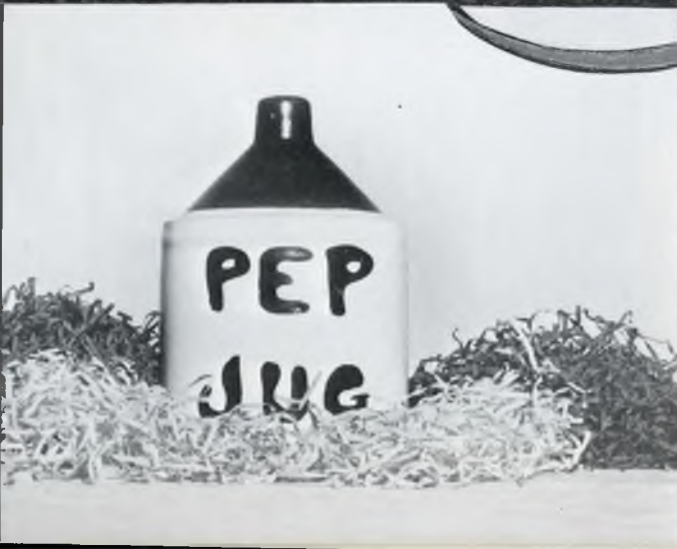

Dedication



Work, will and dedication: earmarks of a 38-year career which ends this year with the retirement of Superintendent of Schools Russell H. Amerman.

Joining the Northville system in 1927 as high school principal, Mr. Amerman advanced to his present post in April, 1933. He has watched the school grow from little more than 600 students in one elementary and one high school, to a still growing plant of 2,401 people. Students now occupy two elementary schools, one junior high, and one high school.

Further growing pains make additional buildings, now on the planning boards, necessary. Mr. Amerman has been largely responsible for the conception of these facilities.

His contribution to the education of the students, and the respect and affection with which he is regarded, is appropriately reflected in the fact that the Russell H. Amerman Elementary School was named in his honor in 1954. His is a legacy not to be forgotten.

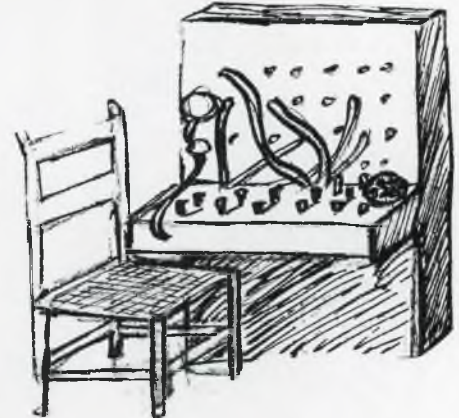

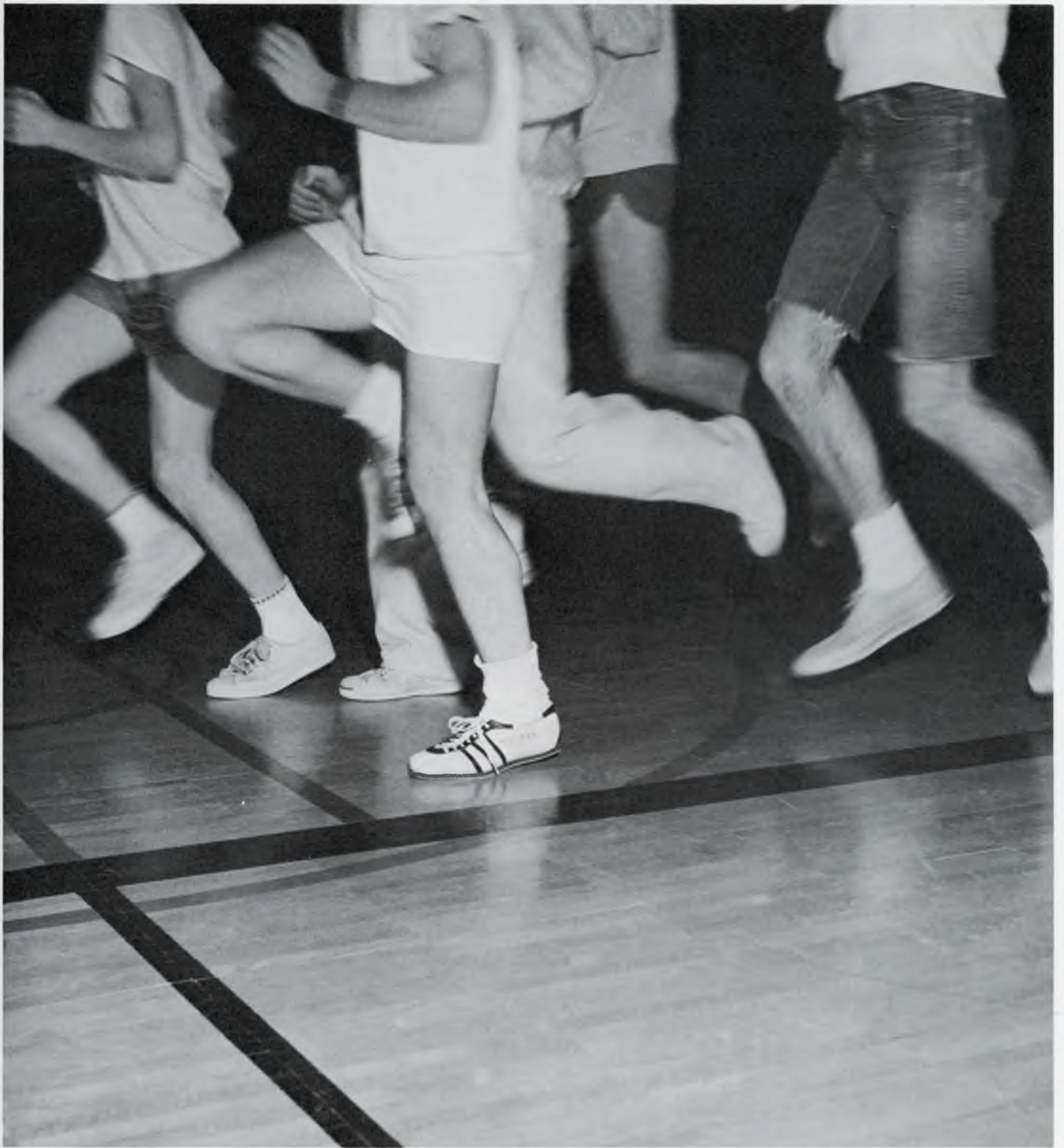
